Awards Update 2023-24

Over the past 2 terms, all the children have been working towards various awards in their planners. These include the Bronze, Silver and Gold awards that children receive when they have earned House Points and Merits in class, as well as Headteacher's Awards and Learners of the Week. Here are the numbers of awards I have presented so far during this school year:

House Points are awarded for outstanding achievement in learning and behaviour. A Headteacher's Award is given for work of an exceptional standard (tremendous effort and hard work at school or at home). One of the best parts of my job is to see both children's work as well as the pride they show when they receive an award.

As parents know, we also celebrate the children who read regularly at home. Last term, we presented every child who filled their page of stars in their planners with a certificate and a Reading Champion wristband. There were 146 children. Thank you very much to the parents who provided me with positive feedback regarding the Attendance RAG reports we sent out to everyone at the end of last week. Just to let you know, there were 210 children who received 'Green' reports (96% or higher), 136 children who received 'Amber' reports (90% to 96%) and 68 children who received 'Red' reports (lower than 90%).
